UPDATE ON DEMOLITION OF BUILDINGS

Nicki Brandenburg was present with concerns about the old coast to coast building that was being removed at this time. She was concerned that water will enter her building the post office since the area that attached to the other building is exposed. She would like to see it taken care of so that she does not get water into her building. The council advised her that it was not their building so she should take it up with the current owner. Schrums are removing the building and expect to be done soon. Both the old library and the old coast to coast will then have been completed. The coffee shop owner Pam Schrader is working with the state on a solution for her building.

BUILDING RENT FOR CITY HALL

The city rents space from Garitt Irey in his building for city offices and meeting space. The city had paid rent for several years to get a discount on the rent to allow for Garitt to make improvements to the building. Garitt inquired about extending the office rent at a discount to allow for him to make some updates on the heating system. The proposal would be to advance \$7,200.00 for three additional years rent. The normal cost for the rent would be \$10,800.00. The city would save \$3,600.00 by extending the contract for office space. A motion was made

by Rick Gutschmidt to approve the payment of \$7,200.00 to add three more years to the contract. The motion was seconded by Stefan Schoenfelder. On a roll call vote all will voted in favor.

UPDATE ON EMPLOYEE HEALTH BENEFIT AND AUDITORS POSITION

Michelle Berry reported that the employee relations committee had met and they are making a recommendation to the council that the current policy on health insurance be terminated and replaced with a defined benefit of \$10,000.00 per year for full time employees and prorated for employees working less that full time. This would be a taxable benefit that could be used for whatever the employee needs to include health insurance. She said they also recommending a 3% increase in hourly wages for Ron and Glen. Glen would receive a \$.75 per hour increase and Ron would receive a \$.80 per hour increase. They were also recommending a salary of \$36,000.0 per year for the new auditor based on a 32 hour work week. This job would continue to be a salaried position. The current benefit of a reduction in the utility bill will end with the exception of Sandi's. Rick Gutschmidt made a motion to approve the recommendations of the committee. The motion was seconded by Michelle Berry. On a roll call vote all voted in favor.

NEW CITY WEB SITE UPDATE

It was reported that Joy Powers and Joe are working with Municipal Impact on getting the new site up and running. They will be moving content from our current provider to the new site. The new web site will have a notification system included. Residents will be able to go to the site and register their phone and email to receive notices that will be sent out regarding city related notifications. A company called PayStar is being recommended to handle payments by credit cards and also they can also handle ACH from banks. The cost for handling ACH is \$25.00 per month. Michelle Berry made a motion to move forward with the Pay Star system. The motion was seconded by Rick Gutschmidt. On a roll call vote all voted in favor.

PURCHASE OF NEW SKID STEER LOADER

The city purchased the current skid steer from Anderson Brothers two years ago with the understanding that a new one could be purchase in two years for \$3,000.00 with the trade of the current one. They have the new one ready for us at the agreed \$3,000.00. A motion was made by Preston Sitzmann and seconded by Sally Caudillo to approve the purchase. On a roll call vote all voted in favor.

SNOW PUSHER

Mayor Triepke reported that we can purchase an eight foot snow pusher for the skid steer for \$2,900.00. Last year we tried putting a wider one and with the wet snow it did not work very well. After some discussion a motion was made by Rick Gutschmidt to approve the purchase. The motion was seconded by Michelle Berry. On a roll call vote all voted in favor.

EASEMENTS FOR STORM SEWER

The city put a storm sewer in Rall's addition that ends up crossing the Steve and Sandi Rupp property and then goes on to Gary and Sandi Horsagers property. City Attorney Kim Radermacher created a easement document to cover the property that is being affected. A motion was made by Preston Sitzmann to approve the easement document. The motion was seconded by Dan Schlosser. All voted in favor.

OTHER BUSINESS

Mayor Triepke reported that Allied Energy had purchased Jerry Lagodinski's building in the industrial park and will be moving NAPA to the building and will also be starting a hardware store. They would like to remove the current curb and replace it with a valley gutter to allow for easier entry to the property for parking. No one objected to the plan. New rates for water and sewer were discussed with the increase from South East Water beginning in 2024. The committee for Utilities will meet and bring back a recommendation on a rate increase and how to handle billing for property owners that currently only spend part of the year here.

Cal reported that he had been approached about purchasing two city lots that were bought out by FEMA. It was reported that they can never be sold and a restricted deed is recorded at the court house stating that the City will remain the owner and must ask permission to build anything on the property. The sale of a lot in Rall's addition that was put out on bids has not been paid for at this time. It was decided to send a registered letter giving him 10 days to complete the purchase.

There was no other business at	this time a motion was made by Rick Gutschmidt to
adjourn the meeting. The motion was s	econded by Dan Schlosser.
